Regular Session

The Greensboro City Council was called to order at 6:00 pm by Mayor Glenn Wright. Council Members present were Mr. McWhorter, Mr. Smith, Mr. Miller, and Mr. Moore.

Mr. McWhorter opened the meeting with prayer.

Mr. McWhorter made the motion to approve the March 1, 2021 Regular Session Minutes as presented, after a second by Mr. Miller the motion passed 4-0-1 with Mr. Moore abstaining.

Chief Monford introduced William Lundy, a new officer with the Department. Officer Lundy thanked the Mayor and Council for the opportunity to serve with the City and stated that he is a native on Union Point and has been certified for 10 years. He has worked with several departments in the surrounding counties, and he came to Greensboro because of the opportunity to work closer to home and to make a difference in his hometown.

Chief Monford stated that the Police Department received the Hometown Heroes Award to purchase bullet proof vests for the officers and 2 employees have been hired to attend the Police academy.

Tommy Nelson presented a stat report and discussed it with the Mayor and City Council. He stated that the crime rates are down from 1 year ago.

The second reading of the ordinance to annex 1021 Airport Road tax parcel 086-0000-18-D into the city limits of Greensboro was done. Mr. Moore made the motion to accept the ordinance as presented, after a second by Mr. Miller the motion was approved 5-0.

Mr. Miller made the motion to approve the Architectural Review Board Certificate of Appropriateness for the proposed Circle K gas station that will be located on Lake Oconee Parkway across from the Chick fil-a restaurant after a second by Mr. McWhorter the motion was approved 5-0.
