Regular Session

The Greensboro City Council Regular Session meeting was called to order by Mayor Corey Williams. Council members present were Mr. Neal, Mrs. Rivers, Mr. Miller, Mr. Moore, and Mr. Rowland.

Mayor Williams opened the meeting with prayer.

Mr. Miller made the motion to approve the March 7, 2022 Regular Session minutes as presented, after a second by Ms. Rivers the motion was approved 5-0.

Mr. Moore made the motion to the March 7, 2022 Executive Session Minutes as presented, after a second by Mr. Rowland the motion was approved 5-0.

Chief Monford introduced two new patrol officers, Pavielle Inglet and Justin Taylor and the new K-9, Coki. Both Officer Inglett and Taylor was given the opportunity to address the Mayor and Council. Assistant Chief Nelson presented a statistical report for the first three months of 2022 and discussed the report with the Council.

Mr. Miller made the motion to not accept the recommendation from the Planning and Zoning Board and deny the conditional use permit request from Henry B. Cottle of Montrose Auction, Inc. to auction firearms at 203 North Main Street, after a second by Mr. Moore the motion was approved 5-0.

Mr. Miller made the motion to appoint Dena Stewart to the Planning and Zoning Board, after a second by Ms. Rivers the motion was approved 5-0.

Mayor Williams appointed Melanie Miller to the Greensboro Housing Authority Board.

Mr. Miller made the motion to schedule the Annual Clean-Up day for April 4th, after a second by Mr. Rowland the motion was approved 5-0.
